This is a well- balanced and challenging question paper and it caters for a range of cognitive levels according to the formal assessment guidelines.

**QUESTION 1**

The candidates response was good because it was a topic that they could relate to and are familiar with in other subjects like Life Orientation.

Teachers should address the Topical issues from a religious point of view.
