HOW TO OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT

- 1 Imagine that you want to save money to buy something. Perhaps you want to buy a bicycle or a computer or a CD player? You can save towards this by putting money into the bank.
- 2 Firstly, it is important to find the right bank. You will need to go to two or three different banks for information. This will help you to decide which bank is right for you. You can judge the service they give you and the products they offer.



- 3 Secondly, you need to know what kind of account to open. Think about how you will use your bank account. This will help you to decide. If you want to use your account to save, then you will probably open a savings account. This type of account allows you to save money over a period of time. You normally have to leave a sum of money in the account. You can earn interest on any extra money you put into the account. Remember to ask about banking fees. There may be monthly charges. Each time that you draw money from an ATM, the bank charges you. Find out how much you will be charged if you draw money at your own bank's ATM and how much you will be charged for using another bank's ATM.
- 4 Thirdly, you will have to provide information to the bank. This means that you need to show some form of identification and give proof of your address. If you are younger than 18 years, you will need the permission of your parents.
- 5 Fourthly, there are terms and conditions that you must agree to.

ENVIRONMENTAL FESTIVALS OF LIMPOPO

- 1 The Limpopo Province in SA is rich in nature and culture. The province also has much for **geologists** and **archaeologists** to study. Each one of its four regions has something unique to celebrate.
- 2 Every harvesting season, the Valley of the Olifants region celebrates the harvest of the Marula fruit. The Marula fruit, which is called the 'food of kings' by the Tsonga people is used in medicine, cosmetics, food dishes and drinks.
