# 2010 GRADE 11 FINAL EXAMINATION

- 1. Assessment Instruction 48 of 2009, dated 20 November 2009, has reference.
- 2. A final time table for the Grade11 Final examination is attached for information and further planning of teaching, learning and assessment activities. (Annexure A)
- 3. Principals are reminded that Grade 11 learners are not permitted to take study leave and teaching and learning is to continue until Friday 29 October 2010 for all Grade 11 learners.
- 4. The Computer Application Technology (CAT) practical examination is on 28 October 2010 and Information Technology practical examination on 29 October 2010. Learners offering these subjects will miss classes up until 11 h30 on these days and will then return to normal classes. Kindly note that schools offering Information Technology will have to set this practical paper.

# 5. 2010 GRADE 11 FINAL EXAMINATION

- The examination commences on Monday 01 November 2010 and concludes on Thursday 30 November 2010.
- Two sessions are scheduled for each day. The morning session will commence at 09h00 and the afternoon session will commence at 14h00. Schools with Muslim learners have indicated a challenge starting the second session at 14h00 on Fridays. These schools may commence these papers at 15h00 if necessary.

- Comments, recommendations and concerns received about the Grade 11 final examination time table have been considered when drawing up this timetable.
- Kindly note that many candidates are required to write two subjects a day. That is the reason for having a morning session that allows a minimum of 2 hours rest before the commencement of the afternoon session. The academic disadvantage experienced by candidates, mentioned in some of the concerns received from schools, is noted, however time constraints do not allow for extension of the duration of the examination.
- A number of question papers will not be supplied by the Province and must be set at school. These subjects were indicated in Assessment Instruction 48 of 2009. *Kindly note however, that due to circumstances beyond the control of the Province, Information Technology P1 and P2 and Music P1 and P2 have been added to this list and schools offering these subjects are required to set these question papers.*
- Principals are cautioned that altering a Provincial examination question paper is an irregularity and will result in candidates having final results withheld while SBA irregularities are investigated. This means that the entire Provincial question paper is to be written by all candidates and the entire script is to be marked as per the marking memorandum issued by the Province.
- Marking memoranda may under no circumstances be altered if work has not been completed at the school. The candidates must receive zero marks for that section.
- All schools are to complete all the Grade 11 outcomes in all subjects offered at the school prior to the start of the final examination. This is very important.

# 6. COLLECTION OF GRADE 11 LEARNER STATISTICS FOR PACKING OF GRADE 11 FINAL EXAMINATION QUESTION PAPERS

- Principals are requested to complete Annexure B with the learner numbers for each subject in the language version of the subjects required. The form is to be returned to the District Office by no later than Friday 06 August 2010.
- Kindly note that these numbers must be accurate and represent the actual number of learners in the school.
- Inflating statistics escalates the cost of printing, packing and transport. Principals are requested to check that all statistics given are correct.
- 7. Principals are to ensure that this information is given to the learners and the teachers as quickly as possible. The co-operation of all stakeholders in the process is appreciated.
