# NATIONAL SENIOR CERTIFICATE (NSC) SUBMISSION OF TERM MARKS –GRADE 12

- 1. Assessment and Examinations Directorate will embark on an analysis of March, June and September marks for Grade 12 to provide feedback for teaching, learning and assessment.
- 2. The analysis will provide data on the performance of Grade 12 schools in all subjects as well as overall performance.
- 3. Quarterly feedback will enable schools to forecast year end results and put remediation measures in place where required.
- 4. Where poor performance is noted, intervention strategies can be planned.
- 5. Schools are required to fill in the attached summary sheets (Annexures A & B) and hand them to District Examinations Section no later than the following dates:
  - Term 1 Friday 17 April 2009
  - Term 2 Friday 24 July 2009
  - Term 3 Friday 09 October 2009

- 6. District Examinations are to submit Annexure A & B for every school with NSC candidates to the Provincial Office no later than the following dates:
  - Term 1 Friday 24 April 2009
  - Term 2 <u>Friday 31 July 2009</u>
  - Term 3 Friday 16 October 2009

### 7. **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- All schools shall submit marks for learners in Grade 12. There will be no exception.
- Marks will be submitted on the attached summary sheet (Annexure A).
- A summary of School Performance will be submitted on Annexure B.
  Refer to ANNEXURE C for a summary of ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO HEI.
- Schools will not be reminded and the dates for submission of the schedules must be adhered to.
- Schools that fail to submit marks according to deadlines will be deemed not to have prepared any marks and will be dealt with accordingly.
- Schools that experience a problem with deadline dates must write to the District Director and explain the problem and state the date on which marks will be submitted.
- Relevant District Officials are expected to exercise oversight of submission of marks.
- Districts are to submit marks recorded on Annexures A & B to the Provincial Office according to deadlines.

#### ATTACHMENT TO ASSESSMENT INSTRUCTION 19

## 1. HIGHER EDUCATION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The set of designated subjects listed below only apply to a Bachelors Degree and not for a Diploma or Higher Certificate Admission.

### 1.1. BACHELORS DEGREE

The candidate must have at least 4 subjects from the list below.

Admission to HEI is dependant on these subjects for which a minimum of 50% in each has been attained.

- Accounting
- Agricultural Science
- Business Studies
- Dramatic Arts
- Economics
- Engineering Graphics and Design
- Geography
- History
- Consumer Studies
- Information Technology
- Languages
- Life Sciences
- Mathematics
- Mathematical Literacy
- Music
- Physical Sciences
- Religion Studies
- Visual Arts

## 1.2 . **DIPLOMA**

- 1.2.1 Seven recognized NSC subjects must be offered.
- 1.2.2 Six NSC subjects passed with 40% & 30% as follows

40% in one of the Official Home Language

40% in 3 subjects

30% in 3 subjects (including the LOLT of the HEI at 1<sup>st</sup> Additional level (English/Afrikaans)

- 1.2.3 If <30% in the seventh subject, successful completion of SBA is necessary.
- 1.2.4 An immigrant can offer one official language for the NSC,( which would preferably be English Home Language) but English 1<sup>st</sup> Additional language would also have to be accepted if passed with 30% as meeting the language requirements. (Therefore if the immigrant candidate does not offer a Home language and achieves 30% in English 1st Additional language the candidate can be awarded admission to a Diploma)

# 1.3 . HIGHER CERTIFICATE-

- 1.3.1 Seven recognized NSC subjects offered. (Do not have to be listed above).
- 1.3.2 Six NSC Subjects passed with 40% & 30% as follows

40% in one official Home language

40% in 2 subjects

30% in 3 subjects (including the LOLT of the HEI at 1st Additional level (English/Afrikaans)

- 1.3.3 If < 30 in the seventh subject successful completion of SBA is necessary.
- 1.3.4 Immigrant requirements (See 1.2.4. above)
