### BACKGROUND:

Learner Attainment remains a priority for the Provincial Department of Education. One of the strategies to assist teachers and learners to improve learner performance in Grade 12 is the development and distribution of **Grade 12 Revision and Remedial Teaching Instruments: Questions and Answers**. These cover each of the Grade 12 subjects offered for the National Senior Certificate (NSC) examinations and take the form of questions and answers.

### GUIDANCE TO SCHOOLS/TEACHERS ON THE USAGE OF SUBJECT INSTRUMENTS:

The questions and answers provided are intended to be:

- utilised in Winter and Spring School vacation classes;
- used during the third term for teaching purposes;
- given to learners for revision and remedial purposes;

- disseminated to learners as homework exercises to re-enforce work already covered.


**NB:**

1. Teachers are advised to provide learners with the suggested answers, on completion of any one or more of the above activities.
2. These instruments are **not intended** for assessment purposes. Subject Advisors, Principals and teachers are advised that any School Based Assessment (SBA) tasks featuring the instrument or any part thereof will not be accepted. Should this occur, teachers and learners will be required to re-do the tasks for SBA moderation.

**LOGISTICS AND DISTRIBUTION:**

1. *The Grade 12 Revision and Remedial Teaching Instruments: Questions and Answers* will be distributed to all FET Schools on the **19 June 2009**. Each school will receive **1 copy** of the questions and suggested answers. Principals are requested to ensure that all subject teachers receive the relevant subject for teaching purposes.
2. Electronic versions of *The Grade 12 Revision and Remedial Teaching Instruments: Questions and Answers* will be distributed to District Chief Education Specialists (CESs) at the Provincial Curriculum Co-Ordinating Committee (PCCC) to be held on 17 – 18th June 2009.
3. District CESs will ensure that each District Subject Advisor receives an e-version of the relevant subject by 19 June 2009.
4. Subject Advisors will in turn ensure that each school offering the subject receives a copy of the e-version of the Instrument before the end of the second term, provided a request be made.
5. In addition, *The Grade 12 Revision and Remedial Teaching Instruments: Questions and Answers* will be uploaded onto the Departmental and Curriculum Management websites and can be accessed at the following addresses:
